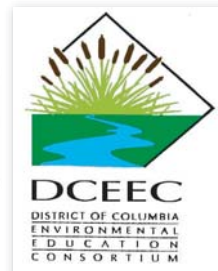

Ludlow-Taylor Elementary:

This dynamic schoolyard site offers students the opportunity to participate in conservation & gardening projects. Check out their courtyard garden!



Brent Elementary:

This site is competing to become the most environmentally friendly school in the District.



Emery Elementary:

Check out how the school's garden is incorporating history curricula into their themed gardening methods and erosion barriers.



T. Marshall Academy HS:
